

OUR IMPACT: Hurricane Milton Disaster Relief



MARC Vistors

• 1,752 visitors served in one week at the Multi-Agency Resource Center (MARC), in partnership with United Against Poverty of Indian River County



Housing Assistance

- 38 families provided with temporary hotel stays, offering a safe space while seeking permanent housing
- 350 homes secured with tarps, protecting against further damage and aiding in rebuilding efforts
- 546 families received assistance with rent, mortgage, and utilities
- 12 homes are currently in the process of being repaired, helping families rebuild their lives



Food Assistance

- \$100,000+ in food products distributed
- \$120,000 in food vouchers provided to families in need



Essential Needs Assistance

- 700 vouchers issued to replace essential clothing, furniture, and home goods
- · 34 mattresses were provided to families in need
- Baby essentials distributed to 67 families, including pack and plays, diapers, and formula



Mental Health Assistance

• Nearly 100 individuals received free therapy through United Way and the Mental Health Collaborative, offering vital emotional support
